



Amanda Thompson, PhD recently joined Life with Cancer at Inova Schar Cancer Institute in Fairfax, VA, where she serves as the Chief of Pediatric Psychology, directs the Child and Adolescent Program, and offers evidence-based treatments to children, adolescents, and young adults with cancer or with a family member with cancer. Dr. Thompson has particular clinical and research interests in bereavement, program development, and the standards of psychosocial care for children with cancer and their families. She publishes frequently in peer-reviewed journals, has written numerous book chapters, and has presented at national and international scientific conferences. Dr. Thompson has been a member of the Children's Oncology Group since 2009 and is the co-Chair and founder of the Palliative Care and End-of-Life Special Interest Group of Division 54 (Pediatric Psychology) of the American Psychological Association.

Dr. Thompson received her Ph.D. in Clinical-Developmental Psychology from the University of Pittsburgh, completed her predoctoral residency in pediatric psychology at the A.I. duPont Hospital for Children in Wilmington, DE, and completed a two-year post-doctoral fellowship in pediatric psycho-oncology at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, OH. Prior to joining Life with Cancer, Dr. Thompson was the Director of Patient Support Services in the Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders at Children's National Hospital in Washington DC.
